

# **A Pilgrim's Progress**

We are on a spiritual journey together and a major part of my responsibility is to guide us in our spiritual growth, helping us develop spirits of compassion, love, and generosity. I'm concerned about our spirits as we are daily bombarded with messages of a woeful economy and how we permit those messages to affect our spirits, our treatment of each other, and our support of the ministry of Glenview Community Church. It is helpful to keep the vision of our congregation in mind: To be a strong community of Christian faith that welcomes and engages all people in personal and spiritual growth. And our daily mission is learning, loving, and serving in God's name. Keeping our vision and mission in mind as we work together will help us do things that nourish our spirits.

We are a rich congregation. I see this every day. We are rich in friendships and relationships. On a regular basis I see and hear people telling about deep, lasting friendships they have made at GCC and how their involvement in the church has had a significant impact on their lives.

Not only are we a rich congregation but also we are a wealthy congregation. We have \$400,000 trust managed by Chicago Community Trust that provides \$25,000 which the Missions Outreach Board disperses for missions each year. We have \$230,000 in Capital Reserve Fund and more than half a million dollars in endowment funds. We have no debt on the property, building, or furnishings. We are a wealthy congregation and 99% of the congregations in this country would love to be in our position.

We just experienced the most generous November in the history of GCC. In November 2008 we gave \$113,596.00 to support the ministry of GCC. And then we followed that with the most generous December, actually the most generous month in the history of GCC, by giving \$240,639.24 in December 2008. Let's celebrate and give thanks for this tremendous generosity.

In the midst of this wonderful generosity, we are building our budget for 2009. Currently, we have a significant shortfall in pledges which is causing some to want deep, swift cuts that would affect several staff members. I am concerned that we are permitting the fear of scarcity rather than the miracle of sufficiency control our spirits and thus dictate our thinking, our focus, and our actions. When we are controlled by a fear of scarcity we become tight fisted.

During 42 years of ministry I have served 7 congregations. They have varied in size from 50 members to 1850 members. Of the seven congregations I have served Glenview Community Church is by far the most affluent congregation and the least generous per capita, giving approximately \$511 per member per year.

When the miracle of sufficiency controls our spirits our attitudes and actions focus on ministry, life management, generosity, and being good stewards of our lives. The story of Jesus feeding the 5000 clearly portrays the miracle of sufficiency. (Luke 9:10-17) Jesus was given a gift of five loaves and two fish. Jesus was open-handed. He opened his hands to receive the gift, he gave thanks for the gift, and with open hands he gave the gift away. And everyone had enough and there were baskets full left over. We need to be open handed rather than tight fisted.

When we are tight fisted we become cruel. When we are open-handed we become compassionate. Cruelty diminishes our spirits and our lives. Compassion expands our spirits and our lives. Let's do everything in our power to be people of compassion and a congregation of generous people.
