The Pilgrim's Progress

In mid December we received a letter from our moderator, Tom Amos, and the Finance Board outlining the economic challenge we face as a congregation. At the time of the letter the Finance Board was projecting a \$63,000 deficit in receipts for 2008 and approximately \$150,000 deficit for the proposed 2009 budget. The good news is that we closed the deficit for 2008 under \$26,000. The challenging news is that reduced projected revenue and additional expenses have raised the budget deficit to \$167,000 for 2009 despite measures such as reducing the business administrator to a half time position and receipt of a generous donation to underwrite some of our leadership expenses.

The Executive Board will recommend a budget for a congregational decision at the mid-winter congregational meeting on Sunday, February 8. Whatever can we do? Two essential steps will erase the deficit in the proposed budget.

One step is increased revenue. The quickest and best quaranteed way for us to increase our revenue is for all members and friends of GCC to increase our financial commitment for 2009. There also is the opportunity for those who have not pledged to do so now and assist us in raising the necessary revenue to continue our ministry at its current level. To all of the 482 households who have pledged, thank you for your generous pledges that total over \$943,000. Now, is it possible for each of you to be a bit more generous and increase your pledge by \$346 or more? If all who pledged will increase their pledges by \$346, (that's \$6.65 per week - 2 lattes or 1 Big Mac Super Size meal per week) we'll erase the deficit in the proposed budget. Peggy and I pledged \$14,000 for 2009. We are striving to do our part by increasing our pledge for 2009 to \$14,500. Of course, if additional households pledge, not only will more people help us erase the deficit but also it will reduce the additional amount needed from those who have already pledged. If you will increase your

pledge for 2009 or have not pledged for 2009 and will do so, please let Dale Wittenberg, our Church Business Administrator, or me know by January 22, 2009.

Another step to a proposed budget is to reduce spending. If we receive less than \$5,000 in additional pledges, we will have to take one or more of the following steps to arrive at our budget for 2009.

- 1. \$14,000 from Nutting Fund for music budget \$14,000
- Request an additional \$915 per month from the Nursery School for copier expenses for 10 months \$ 9,150
- 3. Request a 33% increase from the Resale Shop \$ 1,000
- 4. Request Pageant expenses from Patrons of Pageant Fund \$ 1,500
- 5. Reduce all program budgets by 10% \$ 2,341
- 6. Eliminate printing and mailing Broadcaster \$ 4.000
- 7. Eliminate the recommended increase for all staff-there's been no increase for the ministers in 2008 or 2009 \$16,000
- 8. Reduce the hours the church building is open \$ 5,000
- 9. Eliminate contribution to the capital reserve fund \$20,000
- Eliminate replenishment of our General Fund \$20,000
- 11. Eliminate staff positions \$150,000

Due to the current economic climate, people in our community are in greater need of the ministry of GCC. Yet, we are

Prayer Shawl Ministry

One verse in Acts 16:14 was written about an extraordinary woman named Lydia. This verse describes Lydia as "worshiper of God, listener, dealer in purple cloth." God opened her heart and she and her household were baptized. Lydia offered hospitality and opened her home to others.

A tiny verse – a big ministry. One woman – who decided to be faithful to God and to share with others the gifts given to her by God.

This is what could happen to our Prayer Shawl Ministry at Glenview Community Church as we continue to multiply our efforts and our ministry and outreach to those in need of pastoral care and love. We now have 18 women who are either knitting or crocheting prayer shawls. You will be able to view some of these shawls at our worship service on Sunday, January 18. We will place several of the prayer shawls on the altar and dedicate this ministry and these volunteers who are sharing their gifts and skills. The women offer prayers at home as they do their work. When finished, Rev. Dr. Pam Keckler or Parish Nurse Marilyn Belleau will distribute the shawls, as they "wrap the recipients in God's love and our prayers for their wellbeing."

HISTORY OF PRAYER SHAWL

The original Jewish prayer shawl was worn by Jewish men all the time. They would pull it over their heads when it was time to pray, when they recited their morning prayers – like having "wings" of the garment surrounding them. The hem of the garment has fringes on it and a certain order of the tied knot which is symbolic of healing power.

The Jewish word for the prayer shawl is tallit (or talith), which mean little tent. Not everyone could fit into the small temple to pray, so all had their little tent of privacy for praying.

When Jesus was healing the woman in Luke 8:43-44, she said if only she could touch the hem of Jesus' garment she would be healed. Guess what Jesus was wearing? A prayer shawl. She touched the fringes and was indeed healed.

God bless those who create their prayer shawl and may they feel the strength of one another, and God's healing love and power in their own life as they dwell under God's wings.
