You have gotten to know who I am: my strengths and weaknesses, my convictions and idiosyncrasies, my personality and style and, hopefully most of all, my perspective on the Christian faith.

And I've gotten to know you: your strengths and weaknesses, your convictions and idiosyncrasies, your personality (yes, congregations have personalities!) and style, and the hallmarks of your Christian faith.

In four years, surprise and discovery yield to comfort and dependability. What we all know is that I'm not the perfect pastor, and you're not the perfect church. But we also know that that's how God intends it...that, with our faults and failings we still bear the treasure of God's love in this world. And, by God's grace, perhaps our pastor/people partnership works well enough for us to bear fruit together.

One of the great things we're doing together is our **Forward in** Faith Capital Campaign. The fund-raising portion of that campaign is nearing completion. So now, the fun begins! The newly-appointed Construction Committee has had its first meeting! I am grateful to **Nick Peters** for answering the call to chair the committee, and to Lauren Bauerschmidt, Glenn Kelly, Melinda Krueger, Scott Mc-Clung, Jill Ruter, Steve Sargent and Ellen Scholly for agreeing to serve. Also serving will be the Moderator (Nancy Mullarkey), the Facilities Manager (Jeff Thompson) and the Senior Pastor (me). The first task for this committee will be to merge our plans with the financial resources that the campaign has raised. In that process the committee will be working with **TKWA** (architects), **Pepper** Construction (construction manager) and Jerry Alisio (owner's representative). You will be hearing more about this process and will be invited to provide input. Then, when a plan is developed and approved by the congregation, the committee will move into its second phase of actual construction! It's going to be an exciting time!

Another great thing that's in process is the work of the **Governance Task Force**. Chaired by **Bob McGee**, this task force has been working tirelessly to develop a governance structure for our church that will better enable us to carry out and strengthen our **Message**, **Ministries and Mission**. Look forward to hearing more from this task force soon!

Part of getting to each other well is routines. We've developed those with each other. And, sometimes, routines mean that we take things for granted and allow our intentionality to wane. There is a great deal of competition for our Sunday morning time together. And, in our culture where we view nearly everything as a commodity (What will I get from that?), it's hard to quantify the significance of participating in a faith community where getting and giving are inseparable. If you've strayed from worship, let this be the nudge you need to find your way home!

Finally, March 1st (my fourth anniversary at GCC) is Ash Wednesday. During Lent that begins on Ash Wednesday we will be focusing on the deceptively simple teaching stories that Jesus told. Our Lenten theme is: *In Parables: Little Treasures of Light and Love*.

We've settled in with each other. Yet God keeps urging us to step out of our comfort zones together...to leave behind the things that make us hesitate and hold us back so that faith, hope and love can lead us to places we never imagined we'd go and inspire us to do things we never thought we could do in this adventure that we're on with Jesus! See you in church!

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL RECAP

At its January 24 meeting, the Spiritual Council voted to escalate the 2017 Stewardship Campaign and to ask the congregation to delay a vote on a 2017 budget until May, when more pledge results can be included. The Council expressed optimism that a renewed appeal to the congregation's generosity would provide adequate funds to support the message, ministries and mission of GCC. In the meantime, the church will continue to operate off the 2016 budget.

In his final report to the Council, retiring Treasurer Dave Aki announced that 2016 pledge income exceeded 95% of total pledges, compared to the historical 93% fulfillment rate. 2016 contributions, combined with strong investment returns helped keep the charge to reserves close to the budgeted level in spite of high un-budgeted maintenance expense.

Vice Moderator Gretchen Grad reported that the Leadership Committee has nominated Jane Hund for election to the position of Vice Moderator in May. Barbara Pollak has succeeded Jim Yagelski as chair of the Membership Board. Additionally, new vice chairs are sought for the Finance and Fellowship Boards due to relocations of the 2016-17 vice chairs.

Stewardship Chair Steve Hill reported that to date, church members have pledged \$826,000 for 2017, with 317 pledging units responding. Of note, there are eighty-five 2016 pledging units that have not responded to the 2017 stewardship campaign. Most

Council members volunteered to personally reach out to the congregation for additional pledges.

Construction Committee Chair Nick Peters reported that Scott McClung has joined the Construction Committee, which will meet for the first time on January 31.

Retiring Clerk Bob McGee reported that the Governance Task Force is continuing its work and will solicit feedback on the proposed structure and transition plan over the next few months. The goal of the Task Force now is to meet with the current church boards and groups and to bring the transition process to a new structure for approval at the Annual Meeting in May. Doug Morgan reported that the Personnel and Ministerial Relations Committee has recommended requiring lay staff to bear the cost of adding dependents to their health insurance coverage provided by GCC, This policy would not apply to the employees who have dependent coverage as of January 24, 2017. Council will vote on this proposal at its February meeting.

Finance Board Chair Matt Bauer reported that the current 2017 pledge level of \$826,000 would result in a 2017 budget shortfall of nearly \$350,000. Over the past five years, non-discretionary expenses have outpaced pledge income. Since 2013, the deficit has been offset from unrestricted reserves, and this is not sustainable, as the balance in this fund stands at \$561,000 at the end of 2016.

THANKS TO BOB & DAVE!

Bob McGee and Dave Aki are retiring from their respective roles as Clerk and Treasurer of GCC in February. They have fulfilled their roles with distinction, skill, professionalism and good humor.

Dave was elected Vice Moderator in 2011, and after serving as Moderator and Past Moderator, he accepted the nomination for Treasurer in 2014, tracking GCC's budget, expenditures and financial matters ever since. In addition, Dave leads GCC participation in Rebuilding Together, as part of his role with the Men's Ministry.

Bob, also a past moderator and dedicated volunteer in the youth program, has maintained church records, produced reports to support the work of the Leadership Committee, taken minutes for Spiritual Council, and been the in-house expert on parliamentary procedure and the requirements of the GCC Constitution. Most recently, he has shared his expertise as chair of the Governance Task Force.

The congregation will have the opportunity to join the Spiritual Council in thanking these fine gentlemen at the Midwinter meeting on February 26. The Spiritual Council has endorsed the Leadership Committee's nominations of Chris Clark as Treasurer and Cathy Shapiro as Clerk, for election at that meeting.

These teams bring sandwiches and medical care with them. The Night Ministy also provides housing, health care, outreach, spiritual care and social services to teenagers and young adults in Chicago who struggle with homelessness, poverty and loneliness.
