

A Pilgrim's Progress

Beginning in college and throughout my adult life I have discovered the value of asking questions. One reason for asking questions was my curiosity and desire to know how something worked or why an action was taken. But I also learned that many of the great discoveries were the result of people questioning the popular and accepted explanations of why things were as they were such as the earth is flat and the sun revolves around the earth.

Academically as I began to focus on course work related to my vocation, I discovered that reading the Bible raised all kinds of questions. I recall during that time my good friend and colleague Dan Ivins saying that Jesus was a question man, not an answer man. That was a very helpful statement to me and caused me to look more closely and differently at some of the dialogue passages in the Gospels

I find it intriguing to note the variety of questions that Jesus asked, to whom they were asked, and the responses that people gave to his questions. Jesus' questions included, "Whose image is on the coin?" "Does no one condemn you?" "Who do you say that I am?" "Do you want to be healed?"

When someone asked Jesus a question, he often responded with a question rather than an answer or perhaps better stated his answer was a question. He encouraged curiosity and inquisitiveness as well as inspected what the questioner was searching for and seeking. To the question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responded, "How do you interpret the Scriptures?" One day while taking a walk Jesus noticed two people following him and he asked them a question, "What are you looking for?" Their response is startling, "Where do you live?"

Also interesting about Jesus' interaction with people and the questions he asked

is Jesus never asked the same question to any two people. I wonder why. I think it is because no two people have the same need or are at the same place in their journeys. How the good news of God applies differs with different people. The needs of people are unique and how God's love and grace meet those needs are as varied as there are people. But to know any of this, Jesus had to spend time with people developing relationships, inspecting needs and situations, asking questions. What a great model this is for us to be curious and inquisitive, searching, seeking, asking questions. I encourage us all to be guestion people. Doing so will enable us to discover answers that have meaning and integrity, answers that correct the mistakes of conventional wisdom.

News from a GCC Young Adult in Africa



Jessica Long recently traveled to Burundi to work with an organization called Village Health Works, which is under the larger umbrella of Partners in Health, which is based in Boston. Jessica's support comes from The InterExchange Foundation which is providing her with a grant. The native language of Burundi is in Kirundi, a difficult language to learn. Jessica plans to continue her work in Burundi until the end of next year.

Jessica writes these words:

"Mid-November I moved to Burundi to start work with a wonderful organization called Village Health Works. VHW was started by a native Burundian who fled to the United States during Burundi's civil war in the 1990s. The organization serves primarily as a health clinic in a very rural and poor area. Its 20 full-time staff members (plus five volunteers from Western countries) see about 100 patients per day. The clinic also conducts extensive outreach programs for local community members – organizing agricultural collectives, holding literacy classes, and working with the local government to increase availability of public services in the area.

During my time at the VHW, I've embraced many roles. As a recent computer science graduate (Jessica received her Master's degree in computer science last June), my primary responsibility is to build the technological infrastructure of the clinic. But I've been blessed to be involved in so much of what goes on at the clinic. I regularly take patient vital signs (Jessica is a certified EMT), I teach a class on basic computer proficiency, I've met with local officials to advocate for paved roads and electricity for the surrounding village. Once a week, I even join local community members in digging out the dirt road that leads up the hill to the clinic.

Living in such a remote area of the world has taught me about the power of the human spirit. It is through faith, patience, and a remarkable strength that my neighbors are able to live gracefully in an uncertain environment.

The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) and its member communities are offering a Battery Recycling Program. The Agency has partnered with Interstate Batteries in Skokie to provide the recycling at no cost to SWANCC communities, as a corporate product stewardship initiative.

Batteries accepted in SWANCC's Program include:

- Alkaline: AA, AAA, C, D and 9V
- Rechargeable: NiCd, NiMh, lithium ion, lithium polymer.

Before dropping off rechargeable batteries, residents need to tape the contact points on each battery or place in an individual self-locking plastic baggie to avoid sparks.
