

Pilgrims Progress

I'm struck by how much of the biblical material is about the wilderness. The writers of Genesis tell us that Abraham went out from Ur of the Chaldees and then they trace his wanderings to Haran and Shechem and Egypt and back. The writers of Exodus tell about the Israelites' release from slavery and then they chase them for forty years through the wilderness from Egypt to the Red Sea to Sinai, to the desert of Sin, and finally into Canaan. Two of the Gospel writers tell that Jesus ended his carpentry work with an agonizing struggle in the wilderness for forty days. Other writers tell about the horrible end to Jesus' life and the frightening wilderness in which his followers existed before the church was born. The history of the church has been a series of endings and beginnings with lots of wilderness in the middle.

The wilderness wandering of the Israelites and the wilderness experience of Jesus serve as backdrops for wilderness to be a metaphor for the Lenten season. The purpose of Lent is to focus for six weeks on one's personal and spiritual growth, intentionally working on a specific issue to improve one's life and relationship with God.

Sometimes people choose to spend time in the wilderness. Jesus consciously decided to go into the wilderness and explore who he was and what he was going to do. The circumstance of being freed by the Pharaoh forced the Israelites into the wilderness. There was no where else for them to go. The wilderness segments of our lives are similar. Sometimes we consciously choose to go into uncharted territory to learn, study, be challenged, and to grow. On other occasions we are in the wilderness only because of the circumstances of our lives. If we had had any choice in the matter, we would have chosen to be somewhere else doing almost anything else.

Often our experiences during the Lenten season are a strange combination of a conscious decision to journey into the

wilderness and the unintentional results of life's circumstances that force us to confront and wrestle with things we preferred to leave alone and not face.

Wilderness isn't fun. That's what the Israelites said. In the midst of their struggle they griped, complained, and blamed Moses and God for bringing them out into the wilderness to starve to death. They said they would rather have died in Egypt as slaves having all they wanted to eat, than starve to death in the wilderness.

I am intrigued by the instruction that Moses gave to the people. In the midst of their struggle and agony, Moses directed them to look to the wilderness. Moses was saying to them that somehow the very resources they needed to deal with the agony of the wilderness would come from the wilderness. An old Chinese proverb says, "Go to the heart of trouble. There you will find peace." Somehow the solution to our agony is found in the very middle of the agony. How to make it through the wilderness is found by looking to the wilderness.

During this Lenten season may we look into the wilderness and discover there the solution to whatever agony or struggle we are experiencing. May we discover anew that wherever we are in the wilderness, God is there beside us, supporting, loving, and encouraging us to become the best human beings we can be. May our love for God and for one another grow deeper and stronger as we journey through the Lenten wilderness.



On February 14, GCC Sunday school children from 4 year olds through 4th grade were delighted to be visited by Stephanie Preiser of Heartland Animal Shelter. We learned that Heartland is a "no kill" shelter that saves about 1000 animals a year! Volunteers have even traveled as far away as Kentucky to help save or place homeless animals in need.

Stephanie explained that the Northbrook based Heartland Animal Shelter's mission is to find permanent, loving homes for homeless animals and promote responsible pet ownership through education, community outreach and collaboration while maintaining respect and compassion for all creatures. While homelessness is a difficult concept for children to understand in relation to people, every child can understand the need to find loving homes for dogs and cats.

Children were able to bring donations for Heartland to help fill our donation cage and put a heart on our doggie bone to measure our donation levels. Following Stephanie's presentation, Sunday schoolers filled the Plymouth room while participating in "heart-warming" activities including decorating adoption folders and tying off adorable fleece blankets for the animal cages at the shelter.

The Children's Board and GCC Sunday School will continue collecting your donations for the animal shelter through February 28th when our friends from Heartland return. The needs for Heartland include monetary donations (much needed), towels, newspapers, dog or cat toys without buttons or catnip, canned dog or cat food and more (see web site below for full list of acceptable food brands, toy requests, and other needs). Donations may be dropped off in room 201 during and after church services. During the week, donations can be left in the church office.
