Adult Education will present Jay Forman, Thresholds Vice President for Strategic Development.

Mr. Forman holds an M.S. in Rehabilitation Counseling from IIT, and has been with Thresholds for 35 of the past 37 years. Originally hired as Program Director for Thresholds' first branch agency in the Uptown area of Chicago, Forman helped form a comprehensive mental health agency for the community while spinning off a Thresholds branch to create a free-standing agency which still serves people with mental illness.

Over the years, he has created many of the ongoing Thresholds programs as well as a number of now ongoing free standing community resources. Forman currently serves as Vice President of Strategic Development, in which he works on agency growth, mergers with other agencies and strategic partnerships. He continues to keep his clinical hand in the mix by providing supervision to Thresholds of McHenry County and Thresholds Private Access Services McHenry and The Thresholds Theater Arts project.

Mr. Forman will speak to us about the services Thresholds offers in the community, their integrated approach towards treatment and the implementation of evidence based mental health practices. He will also touch base on some of the needs that people with mental illness have, including the need for housing. This will lead him into speaking about the development of more such housing in Glenview.

INTENT AND PURPOSE of the Capital Reserve Fund (CRF)

The Capital Reserve Fund was created to support ongoing facility needs over the near and long term. We must have a priority goal of implementing a plan for a substantial, reliable and consistent increase in the CRF in order to reduce major capital campaign fatigue and the negative impact of such campaigns on the Church's ability to regularly and incrementally increase fundamental programs and missions of the Church.

In 2005 a study was made of three ways to understand the funds necessary for this program.

- 1) Review of recent and previous Capital Projects with projections of inflation factor to reach an adjusted cost.
- 2) Capital Project needs based on a percentage of property value.
- 3) Experience of other comparable churches.

The conclusion of the study was that the annual target for GCC's funding of the CRF, using 2005 as a starting point, should be approximately \$254,054 (\$240.809 from the recent 20-year annual average plus a 2.5% annual Construction Cost Index [CCI] increase) and going forward such starting amount needs to be adjusted annually per the CCI.

Since that report the CRF has been funded at a little less than \$20,000 each year. It is seriously underfunded. For the past year of 2008 the Facility Manager and Staff have been trying to get caught up on basic cleaning and repair projects. We completed the first floor asbestos abatement of floors in order to re-carpet hallway, Library and Parlor and tile the women's bathroom. We also suffered another water incursion in the basement in September. The fact of keeping our aging building in good repair and meeting all codes in the village is a continuing challenge in terms of cost of materials and paying our staff. We cannot afford to get behind because the cost of not fixing any problem grows exponentially over time.

Following are some projects we have on our calendar:

- 1) Parking lot Phase 1 front drive replacement, repair or replacement of walkways 2009 cost of \$25,000 (includes patching of west lot before winter 2008).
- 2) Parking Lot Phase 2 Replace entire West Parking Lot repair bed and drainage necessary by 2011/2012 cost estimate \$130,000 in 2004.
- 3) Roofing Replace clay tile and felt under-layment on roofs over sanctuary and office/school wing - 2010/2011 - rough est. \$150,000.
- 4) Replace modified bitumen gymnasium roof 2008/2010 cost est. \$18,000.
- 5) Chapel HVAC controls replace asap identified 2007 old est. \$1750.

In order to use any of the Capital Reserve Fund, Properties Board must seek the approval of Finance Board and then Executive Board. Only projects requiring more than \$10,000 are eligible to safeguard that CRF is not used for funding Properties Board's ongoing list of necessary expenses that sometimes exceed our budget.
