HANDS OF PEACE DIALOGUE NIGHT

Please mark your calendars for two upcoming HOP film dialogue nights, featuring the films "Waltz with Bashir" and "Dancing in Jaffa." These events are wonderful opportunities to share various perspectives....plus they are a lot of fun!

Both events will be held in the Atrium Gallery of the Midwest Palliative & Hospice Care Center (2050 Claire Court, Glenview). After each film, we will break up into smaller groups for facilitated discussions. Adults and HOP alumni will be in separate discussion groups. Here are the details:

WALTZ WITH BASHIR 6:30-9:15 p.m., Thursday, March 26

This is an autobiographical animated film about a 19 year-old infantry soldier in Israel's 1982 war with Lebanon. The soldier witnessed the Sabra and Shatila massacre (the massacre of Palestinian refugees by Lebanese Christian militias), but realizes that he has no memory of the event. In 2006, he seeks out others who were in Beirut at the time to discuss their memories. including a psychologist specializing in post-traumatic stress disorders and the first journalist to cover the massacre. The film is both haunting and deeply human, and leaves viewers with piercing questions to explore about the emotional and societal impact of a conflict that continues today.

DANCING IN JAFFA 6:30-9:15 p.m , Thursday, May 28

Pierre Dulaine, an internationally renowned ballroom dancer, fulfills a life-long dream when he takes his program, Dancing Classrooms, back to his city of birth, Jaffa. Over a ten-week period, Pierre teaches 10 yearold Palestinian-Israeli and Jewish-Israeli children to dance and compete together. This film explores the complex stories of three different children who are forced to confront issues of identity, segregation, and racial prejudice as they dance with their "enemy." The classroom becomes a microcosm of the larger Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the struggle to live and work together harmoniously.

Please come at 6:30 p.m. sharp so we can start the movie on time, and please bring a potluck snack to share with the group.
