

Beyond the Fence: Sabbatical Reflections

In November, I wrote about my hopes and goals for my sabbatical. Do you remember the picture of my three little granddaughters looking over the fence? I imagined myself climbing up the fence and looking at my life from a different view. What might be out there for me to explore as I took time for growth and renewal? I want to extend a thank you to the staff and volunteers who "did my work," as well as to the Church, for honoring the commitment of this sabbatical for me. It was exactly what I needed.

This time away, however, was not just about renewal. I had a yearning to go beyond the fence and explore new paths and even some difficult climbs. I learned to conduct six religious songs (by memory) in a five-week class on congregational singing. I took a pottery class for the first time and sat at the wheel trying to form something out of that lump of clay. I consistently exercised my body and mind; reading 28 books from the library (not religious or theological!); trying my hand at painting and drawing; meditating while taking walks through the snow, sometimes to go to a new restaurant and ordering breakfast for one; practicing the piano daily while tackling new and challenging songs.

I scanned Chicago magazines and newspapers for fun events, many of which were free. I enjoyed concerts, and even went to the opera for the first time in my life. I attended a prayer retreat in Colorado and read by the fire in a castle near the Garden of the Gods, surrounded by Pike's Peak. This place of study turned out to be an amazing surprise. (I'll soon be leading a six-week session on conversational prayer here at GCC as a result of what I experienced there among the mountains and warm breezes.)

Many have asked if I was able to visit my grandchildren. Yes! I delighted in spend-

ing time with all four of them. Keira, 4 years old, even gave me directions when I mumbled to myself about where to turn while driving on an unfamiliar road near her home. She said, "Grammy, see that large sign up ahead? You turn left there." Thank you, O wise one.

I fully enjoyed being with my family and celebrating our winter birthdays, including planning and hosting an 80th birthday party for my mother and 88 of her friends in Indiana.

I wanted some significant time for music in my life during this time away. I attended a workshop called "Worship Alive" and had been mesmerized by the piano accompaniments of the guest composer. I instantly ordered most of his music, which consisted primarily of choral anthems for adult choirs. I chose one song I particularly liked, consulted with Andy Lewis, then, purchased the music for our choir to sing later this spring. I will accompany on the piano!

The final highlight of my sabbatical was to record some favorite hymns on the piano in a professional recording studio. I have more work to do before the CD is completed and ready for distribution, but I will keep you posted.

I have a full and satisfied soul. Was it from taking the time for renewal? Yes, but I'd like to think it was because I was open to an experience with God that urged me to venture out and try something new... "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" I decided to go beyond the fence – past the routine and the comfortable, and see what might take place. I'm glad I did. I invite you to take some moments of Sabbath quiet and exploration for yourself during this Lenten season to see what new thing God might be preparing for you.
