

THIS HOLY WEEK

One of the elements that I've introduced in worship at the Glenview Community Church comes at the very beginning of the service: the Trinitarian Declaration. If you've noticed it, you may be wondering what it's all about. It goes like this:

L. Our worship is in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit:
P. ONE GOD, MOTHER OF US ALL.
All. BLESSED BE GOD, FOR EVER AND EVER!

The Trinity is an ancient way to describe who God is. It dates to the 4th and 5th centuries, to the Councils of Nicæa (325 A.D.) and Chalcedon (451 AD). These councils set forth the doctrine that the Godhead is three persons (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) who are co-equal and of the same substance. Chalcedon affirmed this doctrine and clarified the doctrine concerning Christ's two natures: fully human and fully divine.

So why does this matter? For me, this dusty old doctrine matters because it says very clearly that God is not a supreme monarch who rules the world in isolation. Instead, God is a family of three persons. That means that God's very nature is community. God is God the Father, and God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. It takes all three, together, to be God...to be the God family. Just as we cannot become acquainted with any human family without knowing all of the members of that family, so it is with God. God's most basic nature is community...family. That means that God's essence is not powerful domination but vulnerable relationships.

The words that we have been using at GCC in worship are inspired by the Riverside Church in New York. Those words mix the gender metaphors to keep us from getting locked into an exclusively masculine gender metaphor for God. God includes both the

feminine and the masculine, both father and mother.

As we journey together through this Holy Week, my hope is that we will discover again and anew not only how relational our God is, but how relational our faith is. This relational necessity has been a part of our faith tradition for millennia. Indeed, the word synagogue simply means to come together. In our faith we simply must congregate; we simply must form congregations.

One of the most important phrases in the New Testament is made up of two very simple Greek words: huper humon, for us. This simple phrase is the deep meaning of John 3:16. These two words are also the heart and spirit of agape – of sacrificial love – love that is the core, the compassion and the commitment of Jesus' life and ministry – love that is our call to love Jesus who first loved us by becoming Jesus' disciples who care for and serve others and this world.

Each year, Holy Week surprises me with its power to bring me home and make me new. These transformatory moments always happen for me when we're worshipping together. So I pray that you will also experience this movement of the Spirit as we gather for worship...as we tend to our sacred relationships with our God and with God's people.

Yes God is a family. And God calls us to be a family: a family where everyone is welcome...a family where everyone counts...a family where each person is precious and holy. In this family, there's always room for one more...a family that's always inviting new folks in. And the family is incomplete unless it includes you. See you in church!

Late in 1964, the John Birch Society—a well-funded, anti-Communist political action group—established its Midwestern headquarters in Glenview. Over the next few months, local clergy including GCC's Senior Minister, the Rev. Dr. Kenneth E. Nye, publicly expressed opposition to the "Birchers," as they were known, and news media including The New York Times exposed this hometown conflict to a national audience divided by Cold War politics.

Nearly fifty years later, GCC still stands at the crossroads of personal belief and public opinion. On Sunday, April 7, join Susan Johns and Allan Ruter at 9 a.m. in the Chapel as they offer a glimpse into our past through documents from GCC's archives and additional resources provided by Bev Dawson, director of the Glenview History Center.

THE LENTEN PRETZEL

The pretzel has a deep spiritual meaning for Lent. In fact, it was the ancient Christian Lenten bread as far back as the fourth century. In the old Roman Empire, the faithful kept a very strict fast all through Lent: no milk, no butter, no cheese, no eggs, no cream and no meat. They made small breads of water, flour and salt, to remind themselves that Lent was a time of prayer. They shaped these breads in the form of crossed arms for in those days they crossed their arms over the breast while praying. Therefore they called the breads "little arms" (bracellae). From this Latin word, the Germanic people later coined the term "pretzel."

Thus the pretzel is the most appropriate food symbol in Lent. It still shows the form of arms crossed in prayer, reminding us that Lent is a time of prayer. It consists only of water and flour, thus proclaiming Lent as a time of fasting. The earliest picture and description of a pretzel (from the fifth century) may be found in the manuscript-codex No. 3867, V.
