SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

The May Spiritual Council meeting was the last of the current church year. June will mark the beginning of the 2019–2020 year.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Chris Clark reported favorable numbers for April. Due to pledge fulfillment and other income ahead of budget and expenses below budget, we ended the month \$110,000 ahead of budget with a favorable operating income of \$33,000. Forward in Faith pledge fulfillment is at roughly 60 percent.

FURNISHINGS: Jill Ruter and Melinda Krueger reported on the excellent progress of the Furnishings Committee toward making our new and refurbished spaces both comfortable and welcoming. Plans are already in place to refresh the look of West Entrance and Narthex and to furnish the Kitchen Annex, and Jill and Melinda are working with designers to create a plan for the different areas of the Commons. The Women's Association has allocated \$25,000 of funds from the **New to You** shop to purchase furnishings and is exploring other creative ways to buy items needed for the new spaces. Some balance also remains in the \$25,000 matching gift that has been designated for furnishing.

POLICY HANDBOOK: Over the course of the year, the Spiritual Council has been working to create a GCC Policy Handbook that will be a repository of the policies that serve as guidelines for carrying out GCC's message, ministries, and mission. At the May meeting, the Spiritual Council approved several policies covering the work of the Ministries and relating to the use of church facilities. When it is completed at the end of the summer, the Policy Handbook will be made publicly available on the GCC website and in the church office.

GIVING GLIMPSE APRIL 2019

The Message, Ministries and Mission of Glenview Community Church thrive because you fulfill your stewardship commitments and make faithful contributions. It is essential that we remain current in our giving and ensure the fiscal health of the church. In the midst of our busy lives, we offer you this update reminder to keep in focus our progress on completing our financial commitments to GCC. ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING REPORT MAY 19, 2019

The chief business of the Annual Congregational Meeting in May concerned the adoption of the GCC Constitution and Bylaws and the election of church leadership for 2019-2020. Bob McGee presented the Constitution Working Group's proposed package of amendments to the Interim Constitution and Bylaws, which the congregation had adopted in May 2017. After some discussion, the congregation adopted the revised Constitution and Bylaws of Glenview Community Church by a vote of 121 in favor to 3 opposed. Incoming Moderator Brad Smith presented the slate of church leadership candidates, which had previously been approved by the Spiritual Council. The slate was adopted by a unanimous vote.

SENIOR SERMON MEGAN STETTLER



Thomas doubted in Jesus because he couldn't believe in things he couldn't see. Faith was something new for him and something he wasn't sure about yet. I think that feeling parallels that of trying something new or putting yourself in a situation you might not be comfortable with. Many people when coming to PYF for the first time aren't sure what to expect and might need to make sure that their friends are going so they know someone who is there. I experienced the same thing when I started coming. I knew two people pretty well and I would consistently text them every Sunday to make sure they we going to be there.

Putting myself out there was extremely difficult and scary for me. Three years later I don't have to text anyone before PYF because I know that whatever group of people are there I can talk to. This group has meant so much to me throughout high school because it has become my place or rock outside of school. The group is extremely accepting of anyone from any background and at any point in their faith journey. There are definitely a few "doubting Thomases" in the group, but that is ok because we are here to grow together.

One of the first times I realized that PYF was going to be my place was my sophomore year mission trip. It was definitely a little nerve wracking to go on the trip when everyone already seemed so close with each other, but it's one of my favorite trips i've ever been on. My work crew happened to be all girls, some of whom I was extremely close with and many I had only known for a half a year. Very quickly I became close with the girls in my crew--we somehow convinced our adult leaders to take us to dairy queen every day and there's definitely some memories from those ice cream runs that we still talk about.

This group will build you up even when faced with tough times. We have all had issues come up in high school whether it be drama between friends or struggling

to find our place but the group has always been there to help you get through stuff. I personally went through issues with friends towards the end of my junior year and struggled to understand why it was happening. I knew I could turn to the friends I had made in PYF because they have always been there to build me up. The people here are my absolute best friends and they have become so much more than just my church friends. I can talk to them about anything and they will understand. Sometimes it might seem hard to relate to such a diverse group of people, since we are in different grades and participate in different activities at school, but getting to know each other through PYF brings us together.

The numerous retreats we've been on have led to long talks while walking through the woods or memories from staying up late playing card games. I think that the best part about getting to know people outside my typical group is getting to hear all their perspectives on topics, whether it be something happening at school or a topic from church. I cannot imagine leaving the friends I have made through PYF--this group is so much more than a youth group, it's more than just talking about our faith and hanging out once a week. I can truly say that these people standing here are my best friends.



SENIOR SERMON

Earlier on this year, I was having a particularly stressful time with the college process. The rejections from several schools hit me hard and often blinded me from seeing the great opportunities that I did have at the schools I had been accepted into. Now, this will come as no surprise to those who know her, but my mom helped me through every worry, tear, and piece of mail that came along with applications—I truly don't know where I would be without her.

She also reminded me of something that had struck her in her ministry at the church. She recalled the idea of "God Moments" to me, words I had never heard of at the time, but a concept that I now think of as the basis of my faith. At times, the world seems so full of stress and woe that we may find it nearly impossible to see the light through the darkness. It is times like these that I question my faith, wondering if God really is there. To me, "God Moments" are unexpected occurrences in my everyday, ordinary life that remind me that there really is a greater being who is watching over me.

My clearest memory of a God Moment happened my sophomore year.

One of my best friends was suffering from kidney failure. She was chronically in the hospital and came to a point where she was truly fighting for her life on a daily basis. This was something that, up until then, I had never been familiar with in someone so close to me that was also my age. I felt powerless, as there was nothing substantial I could do to help her, except maybe try

to cheer her up. I went to Walgreens and picked out everything from puzzle books to a stuffed animal and even a bottle of gold nail polish. Something in me made me choose the gold over the hundreds of other colors in the aisle that day. I later delivered the care basket to her dad who was headed to the hospital later that afternoon. When he saw the nail polish, he smiled and asked me if I had talked to her earlier that day. When I said no and that the basket was a surprise, his expression was incredulous. He told me that she had asked that morning for gold nail polish.

Now you're probably thinking that nail polish may be a very insignificant luxury in the grand scheme of things, but that day I saw God working in my own life as he told me exactly what I could do to help a friend in need.

In the past month, I was graced with another God Moment through my experiences in the Glenbrook South/Glenbrook North combined musical. Many of the roles are "double cast," or have two different people playing the same part on alternating nights in order to allow more kids opportunities to perform. My part was double cast with a girl named Lauren from Glenbrook North who I barely knew before this year. After looking at some Facebook photos, my Mom realized that Lauren was the daughter of a close friend of hers from high school theater.

Unfortunately, my mom's friend, Lauren's mother, had passed away a few years earlier from cancer. At that time, my mom had felt a sense of loose ends, as she never really got to say goodbye to this woman who she had been so close with in past years. Somehow, however, Lauren and I had been brought together now to get to know one another by a similar passion that both our moms had for performing. We got very close over the weeks we worked on the musical, and last week, before we performed, I showed Lauren some old pictures that my mom had with Lauren's mom in high school. She definitely was moved in seeing these and later told me "thank you for always being a source of happiness to brighten up my day." I see this as a God Moment in my life, as both Lauren and I were given the opportunity to form a similar bond as our mothers. I never knew Lauren's mother personally, but I feel like a piece of each of our moms

lives on in us, continuing the friendship they began. Psalm 46 reads, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging." No matter how hard we struggle on our path to success, God is always there, moving us past these hard times, and reminding us that we are loved by Him and the many others He has put in our lives. I see my family and closest friends as God moments in and of themselves, as somehow they can cheer me up in moments I thought happiness was unattainable. I could go on telling stories about God Moments that I have experienced in my life, but instead I ask all of you to look for these unexpected moments in your own lives, especially in the times where it feels as if there is no hope. When I have doubts of someone watching over me, I remember these moments and find it hard to believe that there was not something greater behind these little miracles in my life, be it a friendship between a second generation, or something as simple as nail polish. Thank you.


CULTURE - JUNE 4
