

GRAND OPENING

What a delight it is to be blessed by our glorious new space each Sunday morning, and especially for fellowship and refreshments after worship! Our inaugural Sunday for the Commons was Rev. Bobbie McKay's Jubilee Anniversary of Ordination on Sunday, June 16. It is such an amazingly gracious and welcoming space that's filled with light and the light of God's love as we share a bite to eat, something to drink, and engaging conversation with one another.

A team of dedicated GCC members and staff have been working tirelessly to reclaim and move into other areas of our facility, both familiar and new. Bill and Heather **Cooper** have invested literally hundreds of hours filing our vast choral music in the new choir library. Led by Jeanie Bond, Joanne Peters and Karen Aldrich, a team has been thoroughly cleaning, organizing and moving back into our main church kitchen. With the care and attention of Melinda Krueger and Jill Ruter, many hands have been clearing the Mayflower Room, distributing furnishings, and making our building ready for ministry. And GCC staff members Susan Woodsome, Frank Pulice, Miguel DelRio and Krys Lezon have been carrying and organizing countless items. It's been a beehive of activity!

Meanwhile in the sanctuary, **Berghaus Pipe Organ Builders** is meticulously cleaning, repairing, updating and restoring the mechanism of our wonderful pipe organ while, at the Berghaus shop in Bellwood, each of our 3,900 pipes is being repaired and renewed in preparation for their return to GCC. It's an amazing process that is being accomplished by artisans with technical expertise and artistic mastery.

All of this is in preparation for a month-long Grand Opening Celebration of our renewed facility and our revitalized ministry at GCC. On Sunday, September 8, we will celebrate **Rally Day** in our traditional fun way with glorious worship, delicious food, warm fellowship, engaging fun, and exciting tours of our new space. Sunday, September 15 will be **Dedication Sunday** as we formally dedicate our new space to the glory of God and to God's service in worship. After worship we will gather in our new Commons where we will continue the dedication and celebration in refreshments, word and music. On September 22 and 29 we will focus on Invitation and Engagement. Music will fill our Commons with a special invitation to our youngest members to participate. And we will have an Open House on a September Saturday for those in Glenview and the surrounding communities who either can't make it on Sunday or are hesitant to engage in worship. It really is going to be a grand Grand Opening!

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT JUNE 5 AND JUNE 25, 2019

The Spiritual Council met twice in June. The June 5 gathering was a special meeting to discuss the results of the focus groups and market research conducted by the marketing firm **31 Lengths** during the spring and to talk about next steps. On June 25, the Spiritual Council held its regular monthly meeting.

Membership and Marketing: The **31 Lengths** report highlighted the unique strengths GCC has to offer to the community, including music, service opportunities, youth programs, and space for calm and spirituality. However, like many churches, we are losing members at a steady rate, and we need to stem this tide to ensure GCC's continued existence. The representative from **31 Lengths** concluded that we should unite the many facets of GCC under the umbrella of a single theme and that we urgently need to energize and modernize our outreach to communicate with all generations in the surrounding community. At the same time, we must work on engagement and retention of existing membership.

The Spiritual Council discussed and approved a proposal for GCC to engage a part-time contractor to work on Membership and Marketing for a two-year trial period. This is not a staff position. The work description includes designing new community outreach initiatives and finding ways to reinvigorate membership. A contracted professional would provide coordination and continuity of efforts that we cannot achieve through the efforts of volunteers.

Treasurer's Report: One key highlight of the June 25 meeting was the Treasurer's Report. Chris Clark reported on a very strong start to the fiscal year, explaining that revenues through May were about \$72,000 ahead of budget while expenses were under budget by \$61,000, leaving us around \$133,000 ahead of budget. He also reported that fulfillment of Forward in Faith pledges is at around two-thirds of the total, which is about the expected level for this point in the campaign.

A GOD MOMENT

Today's God Moment comes from an experience I had with our granddaughter, Shannon, who many of you know about. You've been praying for Shannon's husband, Brent, who has colon cancer and is receiving treatment where they live in Austin, Texas.

Shannon's almost three year old son, Jax, was expressing his strong objections to being told it was nap time and not play time outside with his new baseball equipment. He was not happy and made his unhappiness very known to everyone who would listen.

Shannon remained unflustered by his vocal complaints while she finished feeding his new baby brother. As the feeding finished and complaints got louder, Shannon put the baby down and took Jax by the hand, walking him to the bedroom for his nap. When she came back, Jax complained bitterly for what seemed like a very long time. I waited for her next move. As a great grandparent, I have less tolerance for children's cries but I knew that it was her move, not mine. She said to me, "He has to learn"...four simple words that seemed very powerful. She shrugged her shoulders, repeated her words, "He has to learn".. and he gradually stopped complaining. Her simple wisdom was a powerful God Moment for me.

We all have so much to learn about life and God and how to live in this world. We have so much to learn about how to live with each other. We have to learn that aging, no matter what our age, is filled with continuous learning lessons.

Some of our lessons are very hard. Most of our lessons are repeated over and over until we understand. We seem to have a certain amount of resistance to this ongoing process of change. But all of these experiences teach us essential lessons about God and life and the necessity to grow and change. We are willing to learn because someone has "loved us" into the process.

Sometimes we ask why God hasn't fixed a situation or made life better for us. But God's role in our life is to "love us" into new life. Sometimes the process is not what we want and we may complain bitterly about God's inactivity.

But we "have to learn" that God is a constant source of love for us and to look for those God Moments that remind us that God is very much around to teach us how to live.

Gracious and Loving God: You are our source of love and new life and you are constantly teaching us how to live. Fill us with Your presence that we may learn what we need to learn about You and life and how to recognize You in our lives. And we thank You, also, for all our other teachers. Amen.





CHILDREN AND TEEN FAITH FORMATION MINISTRY

July has been a time of planning and selecting curriculum. I am excited for this upcoming program year because last year was a great time of spiritual growth, community building and serving. As I look at the array of pictures from last year, I am excited for next year. Here is an overview of the curricula we use as the teachers and I accompany our children on their faith journey.

CHURCH SCHOOL

PRESCHOOL - 4TH GRADE will again use the Spark House Curriculum. It is a lectionary-based curriculum that has Bible activities, good discussion questions and helps to identify the moral teaching of the story.

5TH AND 6TH GRADE uses the Connect Curriculum. This curriculum looks at one book of the Bible at a time. It is has a video, a craft and fun ways to look at the Bible. This curriculum helps prepare the children for confirmation.

FISH - FISH meets Wednesdays after school. This year we will open this after school program to our church school participants and the community. The curriculum we will use is Love In the Big World. This focuses on hope, love and kindness.

CONFIRMATION & PYF

Confirmation teachers and I enjoyed using Collaborate, a confirmation curriculum that comes with some important questions. Each student is given a student book that has fun graphics and story boards. The teachers meet with the students in small groups and I lead some large group actives about GCC and the UCC.

612 YOUTH GROUP meets on Wednesdays from 5:30-7:30. This is a combination of a middle school youth group and PYF, GCC's teen youth group. We are looking forward to utilizing the kitchen to return to making paninis, pancakes and ordering pizza for dinner, our favorite trinity of meals. The adult leaders and I then meet with small groups and talk about the week and our faith. We will continue to use Thinking Theologically. Some spirited conversation came from this curriculum last year.

PYF also meets on Sundays and we will focus on resilience with help from a curriculum called Fathom. Games, fun, fellowship and debate will help us learn and think about how God's Love is resilient and can help us to be resilient. This year we will rotate many activities into the year including service, large group games, cooking and fellowship.
