## A GRAND OPENING

It began five and a half years ago when our Properties Board commissioned the Chicago engineering firm **Perry & Associates** to conduct a useful life study of our facility. That study led us to select **TKWA (The Kubala Washatko Architects)** and **Vince Micha, Ethan Bartos** and **Therese Hanson** to help us make a plan to renew our facility. We chose a construction manager and later moved to **Altounian Construction** and **Bill Bennett, Erich Trepte** and **Felipe Espinoza** to establish a price and scope of work. We chose **The AT Group** and **Jerry Aulisio** to represent the church's interests in the process. And we chose **Havey & Associates** and **Steve and Mary Kay Havey** to lead a **Capital Campaign Committee** chaired by **Karen and Tom Aldrich**. This campaign – **Forward in Faith** – elicited pledges of \$3.9 million from many of you to make our project possible. Under the wise and experienced leadership of **Nick Peters**, our **Construction Committee** (**Lauren Bauerschmidt, Glenn Kelly, Melinda Krueger, Scott McClung, Jill Ruter, Steve Sargent, Ellen Scholly, and Moderators Gretchen Grad and Jane Hund**) brought the project within the scope of our funding and worked to make the new space functional, practical, accessible, gracious and attractive.

Now, after five and a half years, our audacious dreams and persistent work have brought this project to completion! Every time I walk into our new space I am amazed and filled with gratitude. Each Sunday morning I am inspired to see how much you are enjoying it as we linger in fellowship with one another.

The purpose of our new space is to support our ministry, and especially to enable and enrich our community together. **Community** is our middle name at GCC. In our genesis, community meant that we were a church for the community of Glenview. Today, **community** is much more focused for us on our relationships with God and one another. We are often drawn together by common interest and purpose. As the old cliché says it: **Birds of a feather flock together**. But the foundation for community in the church is Jesus. Ours is a **Community...in Christ**. This is the theme for the year we are beginning together...a theme that is echoed in one of our great hymns: **Blest be the Tie that Binds our Hearts in Christian Love**. **WE HAVE MEMBERSHIP AND MARKETING SERVICES!**

In early June, the Spiritual Council approved seeking contracted services in the areas of membership and marketing to help share the good news of GCC's Message, Ministries and Mission in the larger community, and to more actively engage our members and friends in GCC's Message, Ministries and Mission.

An article announcing this initiative was published in the Broadcaster and a request for proposals was shared on the website Indeed.com. **ORGAN UPDATE**

Since the end of April, most of our 3865 organ pipes have been in the factory for cleaning and repairs. They are being returned to the organ chambers, tuned and voiced (adjusted for balance within each rank of pipes, balance among ranks of pipes, etc.). Thank you to Berghaus Pipe Organ Builders of Bellwood, IL for their meticulous work in cleaning and restoring our King of Instruments!

In addition to cleaning & repairs, we have moved one of the blowers for the organ out of the chambers and into the "choir stairwell." Though it was part of the original plan for the organ in 1999 to install this blower in the stairwell, it was inserted to the organ chamber itself, resulting in a loud hissing sound that we have become accustomed into in the sanctuary. The blower supports the higher wind pressure of the Major Tuba rank of pipes - our largest sounding solo reed stop. This was part of the "While We're At It" list of work done to the organ over the past few months. Stay tuned for more before/after pictures of some of the other work that has been done to help the Buzard, Opus 21, sing even better than she did before!

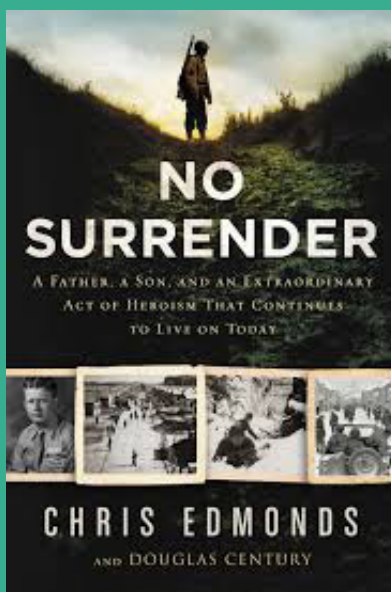
