For a number of years the Glenview Community Church has been printing hymns in the Sunday worship bulletin to augment the hymn collection that's contained in our venerable Pilgrim Hymnal. The Pilgrim Hymnal, long regarded as one of the finest hymnals of our tradition, was last revised and updated 55 years ago in 1958 and will not be updated again. In those 55 years, many new hymns have been written. In order to give the Pilgrim Hymnal a contemporary companion in our pews, the Music, Services and Sacraments and Executive Boards approved the purchase of a new hymnal: *Glory to God: Hymns, Psalms and Spiritual Songs*. Published and distributed this fall by Westminster John Knox Press, it will includes 850 hymns, as well as other worship resources. F. Russell Mitman, former Conference Minister of the UCC's Pennsylvania Southeast Conference and longtime friend of Pam Keckler, was a consultant in its development. Dr. Mitman writes:

"Glory to God: Hymns, Psalms and Spiritual Songs is a wonderful collection of song that is a gracious gift to the ecumenical church. The editors have done a masterful job of selecting a diverse and inclusive collection of texts and tunes both ancient and modern, traditional and contemporary."

Book Plates will be placed in the inside front covers of the hymnals, indicating the donor(s) name(s) as well as a dedication. The cost is \$18.00 each.
