

IT'S GETTING VERY REAL!

Last Friday Pepper Construction cut nine holes in various spots in the ceilings of our church building. It was an intricate and an expensive process because all of the areas where the holes had to be opened have asbestos that must be abated. However, it was necessary to see exactly how our building is constructed because the blueprints of the several phases of our facility are frustratingly vague. Now we'll know exactly what we're dealing with. Now the architects and engineers will know exactly how to plan. Now we'll have a much more accurate estimate of the cost of our church's renewal that will make its core state of the art, accessible and welcoming. But, most of all, seeing and hearing the process of opening these access holes (even though it set off the fire alarm!) made it obvious that we are actually moving toward a project that will make significant changes in the bricks and mortar of GCC's physical home that will make it a much more habitable and nurturing home for ALL God's people. It's getting very real!

Even as Pepper Construction was cutting these holes, Hurricane Maria was devastating Puerto Rico. The initial reports are of unprecedented, overwhelming destruction. Many are saying that Puerto Rico will never be the same again. This train of Atlantic hurricanes has been so devastating to the Caribbean islands and the United States mainland. It's impossible for me to imagine how, in the vortex of these hurricanes, anyone among us can continue to insist that climate change is a hoax. We have shamelessly stolen from and mercilessly violated the environment for our own myopic greed...and the change we have wrought

in our world's climate and ecosystem may be beyond the point of recovery. With this season of storms, fires and earthquakes, *it's getting very real*.

In response to the hurricanes and their victims, I challenged us to give at least \$10,000 to support the United Church of Christ Disaster Relief Ministry and Church World Service. You have achieved that goal and exceeded it! As of this writing, we have contributed \$12,000. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! Because of your tender hearts, our love *is getting very real!*

This is an exciting season in the life of the Glenview Community Church! If you haven't been around for a while...if other things are stealing your time and attention away from God and Christ's perfect love... it's time to come home! It's time to see, and hear, and experience what God is doing in our lives today. It's time to participate in the healing and hope that only God's grace can make possible in our lives. It's time that **God got very real for you!**

Your place in your pew is reserved for you! No one else can fill it for you. Your participation in God's transformation is waiting for you! No one can do what you can do. Your celebration of God's overwhelming generosity is waiting for you! Nothing can make your life more rich or full.

So come and participate in worship...in something larger than yourself. And come and see how we are responding to personal human need in a compassionate and caring way. Come and see what the construction

CWG stands for Constitution Working Group, which the Spiritual Council approved in June 2017 and appointed the following members to serve: Tom Aldrich, Paul Bauerschmidt, Debby Fosdick, Stephen Isaacs, Megan McClung, Bob McGee (chair), Nancy Mullarkey, and Sally Sargent.

The CWG's task is to refine our current Interim Constitution and Bylaws, capturing feedback from the congregation and revising as needed during our 2-year transition period. The CWG will revise and submit the final GCC Constitution and Bylaws to the congregation for vote at the May 2019 Annual Meeting. The CWG is also empowered to propose more urgent revisions to the congregation if needed before May 2019.

The CWG will periodically update the Spiritual Council, regularly report at congregational meetings and submit articles, from time to time, in the Broadcaster. NEIGHBORS IN NEED SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1

Please consider supporting our **Neighbors** *in Need* (NIN). It is a special mission offering of the UCC that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry(CAIM). Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries(JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants.

Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to addressing systemic injustice. Funding is provided through donations to the **Neighbors in Need** offering.

HURRICANE IRMA

- In Florida we are aware of 2 churches that lost steeples
 - o United Church UCC Marco Island, FL
 - o Pass-a-Grille Beach Community Church Saint Pete Beach, FL.
- We have not received a report for the First Congregational UCC
 Key West, FL, but we expect that they suffered damage.
- UCC Disaster Ministries has provided a \$1,500 solidarity/emergency grant to the Miami Shores Community Church (UCC) supporting the purchase of a generator (charging station for the community), fuel, gas stoves for community cooking, purchasing and distributing ice.
 - o Additional offers of solidarity/emergency grants have been made to UCC congregations in the impacted region.
- UCC Disaster Ministries has contributed \$10,000 toward a proactive program to prevent cholera and malnutrition in Haiti in the wake of Hurricane Irma, and to treat any instances that occur. The implementing partner is IMA World Health, of which the UCC is a member organization.
- UCC Disaster Ministries is providing \$10,000 to support partners in Cuba with the distribution of WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene), temporary shelter, non-food items, food security, recovery/livelihoods, and psychosocial support.
- **UCC Disaster Ministries** is providing **\$10,000** to support work in Northern Haiti with the areas where homes that were weakened by Hurricane Matthew have now sustained additional damage. The implementing partner is **Church World Service** (CWS), of which the UCC is a member organization









UCC Disaster Ministries through our annual contribution to the ACT
 Alliance Rapid Response Fund we are supporting Food Security, nonfood items and WASH in the Dominican Republic.

HURRICANE MARIA

Hurricane Maria hit islands in the Caribbean on September 19 as a Category 5 hurricane following in the path of Hurricane Irma.

THE DISASTER BY THE NUMBERS:

10,600 people in shelters in Puerto Rico.

Puerto Rico's power grid is completely down. There is no electricity on the island and officials estimate 6 months to completely restore the grid.

40 inches of rain in just 24 hours landed in parts of Puerto Rico.

90% of buildings in Dominica were damaged.

All 32 provinces in the Dominican Republic are under hurricane alert Media are reporting around 30 storm-related fatalities.

NEEDS

- Cash Donations are the most effective, efficient and truly compassionate way to give.
- All in-kind (stuff) donations are discouraged unless a specific request has come from a reputable organization with pre-established networks and local presence in the impacted communities.
- Cleanup buckets are still needed <u>www.ucc.org/disaster_2017_matching_grants_for_cws_kits_home_page</u>.
- Volunteers (Roofers) are urgently needed in Volusia County www.ucc.org/disaster-matthew-recovery-volusia-county-florida
 - o Volusia County emergency management director Jim Judge said Thursday Irma caused at least \$319 million in damage in the county. 53 VIND clients need their roofs tarped due to lost shingles or previous tarps blown away.
 - o Note that this county was still recovering from Hurricane Matthew and has now sustained more damage from Hurricane Irma.

RATIONALE FOR SUPPORTING UCC DISASTER MINISTRIES

I have been receiving inquiries about why individuals should consider supporting *UCC Disaster Ministries* over other organizations. Below is my short response.

My argument for sending funds to the UCC vs. Red Cross or some other well-known organization is simple. Long-term recovery work supports the most vulnerable populations (elderly, disabled, single parent households, low income, etc.) These are the people that have needs that extend beyond the first few days/weeks. Additionally, the long-term phase of recovery is the most expensive and most underfunded/supported phase of disaster. If we are called to serve the least of these... it's during this phase of disaster. I would also note that because of our size we are able to be nimble and flexible which allows us to address unique needs within each community and to fill gaps in services.
