MONEY

This Sunday, November 10th, is Stewardship Sunday across the United Church of Christ. For us at the Glenview Community Church, Stewardship Sunday means that we will consecrate the financial commitments we have made on our Financial Commitment cards for God's work in and through the Glenview Community Church in 2014.

This year the Stewardship Board decided to change the name of the promise we make to participate in the ministry of our church. The name we've traditionally used is **pledge**. This year's name – **financial commitment** – is more specific and direct. This process is about our decision...our financial commitment...to provide the money the church needs for its ministry. And the goal is lofty: \$1,100,000; nearly \$300,000 more than what we committed in 2013.

I'm not sure why, but it's not easy for the church to talk about money. Some say that that's because money isn't spiritual: that it's too worldly and too easily becomes the seductive expression of oppression and greed. Two passages of scripture specifically speak to this matter.

For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

--1 Timothy 6:10

Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." So we can say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?"

--Hebrews 3:5-6

The passage from 1 Timothy is often misquoted: **money is the root of all evil**. But the truth is that money is inert: it is neither good nor evil. The goodness or the evilness

have to do with how we value it and use it. Money is currency. It is the system we use to conduct commerce; a system more objective than the subjective system of barter and trade. That's all innocent enough. But money loses its innocence to sin when we use it as a tool of power and control, a weapon to wound and destroy, a measure of value and worth, a guarantee of safety and security. When we do these things we make money an idol; we put it in the place that belongs to God alone.

But money also loses its innocence to holiness when we use it as a tool of dignity and humanity, an engine of healing and hope, an agent of mercy and grace, a generous gift to God of faith and praise. When we do these things, we make money a tangible expression of God's love in the world...the world that God loved so much that God made love human in the flesh and blood of Jesus.

As God gave Jesus to the world to participate fully in its physical realities and transform them toward justice and peace, so God creates and calls the church – **yes, the Glenview Community Church!** – to participate fully in this world's physical realities and to transform them toward justice and peace. For our church to do that it needs to be well supplied with the currency of this world...and that means money. Our heritage believes that we cannot serve God faithfully if we separate our physical realities from our spiritual realities. Following Jesus means living and loving fully in this world. Doing that requires the currency of our commerce. That means money. Remember, for money, the value depends on how we use it. With God's help, how we use it will make it holy. In a church whose ministry runs on money...but whose ministry is powered and led by the Spirit of God, I hope to see you soon!

EXTRAVAGANT WELCOME

The Community Renewal Society thanks GCC for the warm hospitality extended by our pastors, many volunteers, and choir members for its Annual Membership Assembly on October 5, 2013.

More than 350 spirit-filled participants enjoyed plentiful food and lively music. Among the speakers, United Church of Christ Illinois Conference Minister, Reverend Jorge Morales welcomed the attendees on behalf of the UCC recognizing that predecessors of the denomination were founders of the Community Renewal Society.

We celebrated legislative successes including

- the signing of the Sealing Bill which will help non-violent former offenders get jobs,
- a new partnership with Walgreen's to train and hire former offenders, and
- the signing of the gun safety act, which should reduce illegal gun trafficking in Illinois by requiring universal background checks and mandatory reporting of lost and stolen hand guns.

Members committed to work for

- creating restorative justice peace hubs in the violent neighborhoods of Chicago,
- developing job training and job creation programs,
- amending the Illinois Constitution to permit a fair tax,
- developing land banks to return abandoned property in blighted neighborhoods to the tax base and productive use that enhances the quality of life of the remaining residents.

The Faith in Action Team specifically thanks Pastors Mize and Keckler and Gary Wendt for setting the spiritual tone for the meeting, Barry Nelson for ensuring that everyone could hear the music and speeches, the Men's group and several women for serving as registrars and ambassadors, the ushers, the dads and kids on the clean-up crew, the Women's Association for food donations, and Chapter 7 for homemade food served with warmth and love. Church staff gave great advice and met every need for a well-organized and welcoming facility.
