Pilgrim's Progress

In the biblical material the sabbatical idea is demonstrated in crop rotation. In Exodus (23:10-11), Leviticus (25:1-7), and Deuteronomy (15:1-6), each seventh year a field was to rest. The land was to have a Sabbath just as people were. The Sabbath year was for the land to lie fallow. Anything that grew on the land voluntarily was to be available for harvest and use by the poor but the owner of the land was not to plant or harvest anything from the land during the seventh year. Through the centuries the sabbatical concept became valuable in other areas of life. During our college careers we knew professors who were on sabbatical leave. The purpose of the sabbatical is to change the routine and setting, rest, explore areas of interest in one's field that the person has been unable to do because of time constraints and responsibilities.

Church leaders have recognized that a sabbatical leave is appropriate for ministers to remain spiritually grounded, emotionally balanced, mentally growing, and physically fit. What is recommended by the United Church of Christ to its congregations is ministers be provided a three month sabbatical after each five years of service. This is what is offered to each of the ministers who serve Glenview Community Church.

Many things necessary for the faithful practice of ministry are in short supply. Nothing, however, seems in shorter supply than time: time for prayer, time for family, time for study, and time for self. A sabbatical provides a chance to step out and step back from the pace and pressures of ministry. When clergy have opportunity for learning, growth, and recreation they also learn the habits and practices that sustain them in and for meaningful ministry. During a season of personal renewal, study, and reflection ministers embrace the gifts of time and Sabbath for their lives and ministries. As they are renewed and strengthened so are their families, and so is the Church.

During sabbatical it is helpful for the minister to center on a theme of concern, topic of study, area of inquiry, or focus of reflection

designed to: nourish vocational identity and commitment, refresh body and spirit while renewing relationships, and rekindle habits of heart and mind that sustain one for and in ministry. Areas of focus and inquire might include: spiritual practices, pastoral imagination, worship, the changing face of ministry, or another related subject.

Rev. Dr. Pam Keckler submitted her request to the Personnel and Ministerial Relations Committee a year ago for a sabbatical leave from December 1, 2009 through February 28, 2010. She consulted with me about a time for sabbatical that would be most beneficial to Pam and being away have the least impact on her areas of responsibility. We concluded together that the requested time frame met those criteria. Pam presented her request to PMRC, they concurred with her request, recommended her sabbatical to the Executive Board and the Executive Board approved the request in December 2008. Pam has an excellent plan for her sabbatical which she shared with PMRC and will share through you in a future edition of the Broadcaster.

As part of our fellowship time following worship on November 29, we will be offering our encouragement, support, and prayers for Pam as she embarks on her sabbatical. With great gratitude for her ministry among us, we will send her forth for renewal, refreshment, and rest. We will pray for her while she is away, eagerly await her return, and joyfully welcome her back on March 1, 2010.

Organ Rededication and Birthday Celebration Concert

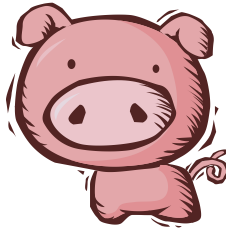
Please join us on Sunday, November 15 at 3:00 p.m. for the feature

Swine Flu

H1N1 FLU UPDATE



The H1N1 vaccine is available. Each state will develop a vaccine delivery plan. Initial target groups for vaccination are pregnant women and the population who have been getting the flu:

- 0 to 4 yrs. (17.2%)
- 5 to 24 yrs (21.6 %);
- 25 yrs through 49 yrs. (5.4 %);
- 50 yrs to 64 yrs (3%);
- 65 yrs and older (1%).



Be patient and don't allow the media to produce fear in you. Meanwhile, here's what you CAN do to prevent this disease from spreading:

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough, then immediately throw it in the trash (*virus can live 24 hours on the surface of an item*).



Wash your hands often with soap and water. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective. We now have cleaners in the narthex, transept and church office.

Avoid spreading germs by not touching your eyes, nose or mouth. You may be infecting yourself!



Stay home at least 24 hours if you are sick. You are contagious the day before symptoms and 5-7 days after. You are contagious if you have a fever.

Get your seasonal flu shot as early as possible.
